RESOLUTION No. 2016-03**

A RESOLUTION ESTABLISHING FEES FOR MOSIER CEMETERIES

The City Council finds as follows:

WHEREAS, the City Council of the City of Mosier owns and maintains cemeteries and has authority to set fees according to Mosier Municipal Code Chapter 11.04 Municipal Cemeteries, Section 11.04.020 C. Price, and;

WHEREAS, the City Council of the City of Mosier has not increased fees since April 1st, 2015 to keep up with charges for goods and services, and;

WHEREAS, the rates established in this resolution shall be used for paying costs of upkeep of facilities such as signage and fencing, landscaping and other maintenance, and administration, and;

WHEREAS, the costs associated with cemetery administration and maintenance have increased, and;

WHEREAS, the maintenance and administration costs for the Mosier Cemeteries for both Standard Cemetery Plots and Cremains Plots is the same;

NOW THEREFORE, BE IT RESOLVED BY THE CITY OF MOSIER that the City Council hereby establishes the following fees for cemetery use:

Section 1. Cemetery Use Fees

- a. Right of interment for Cemetery Plots (Mosier State Road Cemetery) \$650.00

Available only as needed except for spouses who may purchase the plot next to a deceased spouse.

- b. Cremains Plots (Mosier State Road and Mosier Pioneer Cemeteries) \$650.00

Mosier Pioneer Cemetery and some State Road Cemetery Aisle spaces allow for cremains burials only.

Standard Plots and Aisle Spaces at the State Rd. Cemetery allow for up to four cremains burials.

Mosier Pioneer Cemetery are available and allow for up to four cremains burials.

- c. Interment (this is an administrative fee and does not cover the actual burial)

Burial of Caskets \$100.00


Burial of Cremains \$100.00

Rights of interment are not transferable. Cemetery Plots purchased before the immediate need rule that will not be used should be returned to the City so that they can be made available to the community.
